Graduate Admissions

A. Purpose

The purpose of this policy is to define graduate admission standards.

B. Scope

This policy applies to all candidates for admission to graduate studies.

C. Key words and phrases:

GMAT: Graduate Management Admission Test

GRE: Graduate Management Admission Test

IELTS: International English Language Testing System

Praxis: a Pre-Professional Skills Test

TOEFL: Test of English as a Foreign Language

D. Policy & Procedure(s)

I. Minimum requirements for acceptance into a graduate program include:

- Official transcripts showing a baccalaureate degree earned from an accredited institution of higher learning. The Dean of Graduate Studies is authorized to act with discretion and/or upon recommendation from graduate department chairs or graduate program directors when evidence is presented for other considerations (e.g., international universities and other special considerations).
- Attain an appropriate test score (GRE, GMAT, or Praxis) as determined by each graduate program.
- Three (3) letters of recommendation from professors or immediate supervisors mailed directly to Kutztown University. Two (2) letters of recommendation are required for the MBA program. Additional requirements for acceptance into a graduate program vary by major and may include one or more of the following items:

Essays

Resume

Teacher certification

Statement of personal and career goals and objectives

Personal interview

Additional minimum requirements for acceptance into a graduate program for all international graduate students at KU are submission of one of the following test exam scores:

TOEFL score of 79 on the Internet-based test (IBT) or 550 on the paper based exam.

6.5 IELTS

II. For accepted conditional admission all Kutztown University students would:

1. Meet requirements as described in I. above.
2. Meet such individual academic requirements as may be prescribed by the Dean of Graduate Studies and/or the appropriate chair or program director at the time of the admissions decision by the appropriate academic department. In the case of graduate course requirements as a stated condition of conditional admission this is limited to a maximum of nine (9) credits. This status may be extended by the Dean of Graduate Studies if special conditions warrant or upon recommendation by a department chair or graduate program director (e.g., in order to accommodate a two-semester course sequence). Students who are offered conditional admission are required to submit all remaining admissions materials within the first semester of enrollment.

III. For accepted “Professional Credits” admission, all students would:

1. Complete application prior to start of semester.
2. Provide evidence of holding a bachelor’s degree.

Note: An unlimited number of courses may be taken by a student in the Professional Credits category. However, if after taking courses for professional credits, a student decides to apply to a Master’s program, only nine (9) credits may be applied to the student’s degree at the discretion of the department.
